

DECREE

I, Bishop Milan Lach, S.J. dispense all the faithful of the Eparchy of Parma from the obligation of attending Sunday Divine Liturgies effective today through, and including, May 17, 2020. You are not dispensed from prayer on Sunday, the day of prayer and rest.

After a very difficult few weeks of the COVID-19 outbreak and now further developments towards the reopening of businesses, my hope and desire is that we will be able to reopen our churches for public liturgical celebrations on Pentecost Sunday, May 31, 2020. With the understanding that our Eparchy encompasses the territory of twelve states, I will be considering the situation in each region respectively and thus some churches may not reopen until a later date.

Every joyful celebration is anticipated with good preparation and so I would like to encourage you, knowing that soon we will be able to joyfully celebrate together again, to prepare yourselves for the celebration of the Divine Liturgy and reception of the Holy Eucharist. Even during this pandemic, God is inviting us to think more deeply about ourselves, about Him, about our spiritual life, and about the spiritual meaning of our lives. During this time, God is giving us a great opportunity for a new beginning, a fresh restart. I encourage you and invite you to prepare yourselves by making arrangements with your priest to receive the Mystery of Holy Reconciliation. Please take advantage of this time of grace to spiritually prepare yourselves (an examination of conscience is available at www.parma.org).

For now, liturgical services will continue to be livestreamed at http://parma.org/live or may be available through your parish website. All Sunday and weekday services and activities remain suspended for the public. Please know that the priests are celebrating these services privately and praying for you. Baptisms, funerals, and weddings can be celebrated with the immediate family only. Churches may be open for personal prayer only at the dedicated time allotted by your pastor.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, today on May 1, 2020 I entrust the whole Eparchy of Parma to the protection of the Most Holy Theotokos, along with the Bishops of the USA and Canada. Please continue to pray during this month of May with your families, especially praying the Moleben, Akathist, and Paraklesis to the Theotokos (texts are available at www.parma.org) for the protection of Mary, and for those who are infected and dying from this virus in our country and throughout the world. Please also pray for health care workers and our government, as they work to protect our lives.

Healing the Heart

A monk, well known for his holiness, once went on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. He had the great fortune of visiting many of the places where Jesus lived and taught. One of his great privileges was to visit the Jordan River, where he immersed himself in the very water in which Jesus had been baptized. He was very eager to take some of this Jordan River water back to the monastery.

As he was journeying back to the monastery, however, he encountered a beggar. The beggar wanted nothing more than a sip of water. The monk refused the request, explaining that the only water he had left was very special water from the Jordan River, and it was not for drinking or sharing. The beggar persisted, and the monk grew angry and cursed the beggar. At that

moment the monk heard the words, "My son, you have washed your body in the Jordan River, but you have not washed your heart." With that, the beggar vanished from his sight.

In the Gospel reading today, we hear of Jesus' cure of a paralyzed man near the pool of Bethesda. It was believed that anyone who washed in that pool, during the stirring of the water, would be cured. How wonderful it would be, we might say to ourselves, to have such a pool of healing today. Let us remember that we do not need a pool or any other means of miracles when we have Christ Himself. Our Risen Lord, Who has power over death, certainly has dominion over illness and our bodies as well. Sometimes, however, He desires for us a healing of the heart, before a healing of the body.
