

The History of Zelie's Home

On July 1, 2020 Zelie's Home renewed its commitment to women in need of shelter and support during pregnancy and early parenting months. First established as The Zechariah House in Parma, Ohio on June 24, 2009, the house was part of the Maggie's Place family based in Arizona. It operated on the strong foundation of that organization's mission and practices. In 2016, The Zechariah House closed for an anticipated renovation. With recurring delays, we realized that Providence was inviting us to look at other options. In 2018, The Zechariah House moved to Garfield Heights, Ohio with an increased capacity to welcome and offer services for up to 12 women at a time.

To better serve the needs of women in Northeast Ohio, the Board of Directors of The Zechariah House decided in the Spring of 2020 to establish a home independent of Maggie's Place, Arizona. In a matter of two months, the staff and Board of Directors, along with a group of dedicated volunteers, worked tirelessly to create this new entity. Zelie's Home embodies the spirit of Maggie's Place while responding to the unique needs of moms and babies in the Cleveland area.

- For Our Children Holy Father Nicholas, pray for us! (40 times)
- For the Sick and Those in Need O Most Holy Trinity, save us! (40 times)
- For Our Parish O Most Holy Theotokos, pray for us! (40 times)
- For the courage to sing in church Holy Father Roman, pray for us! (40 times)
- For the departed Psalm 51, 91, 119 (50, 90, 118 in LXX)
- Jesus Prayer "Lord Jesus Christ, * Son of God, * have mercy on me* a sinner!"

Every evening before you go to bed, simply go through the whole day and think what you have done right or wrong, do the examination of conscience, and ask the good Lord for forgiveness. Make a sign of the cross over the place where you sleep and say: "Into your hands, O Lord, I commend my soul and body. Do You Yourself bless me, have mercy on me, and grant me life eternal. Amen."

Pray for Me

When we become ill, or when someone we love becomes ill, one of the first things we do is to ask others for their prayers. We might make these requests of our pastor, of a friend, of a family member or even of a total stranger sitting next to us in the doctor's office. But, do we remember to ask the saints to pray with us and for us as well?

Remember, the saints - who in this life were pleasing to God - now have great intercessory power before the Lord. Moreover, some saints have traditionally been regarded as being exceptionally helpful in prayers for the sick. Once such saint is Saint Panteleimon, whose feast we celebrate on July 27th.

Panteleimon was a doctor - a physician - who lived in the late third century. He, to-

gether with his mentor, instructor, and fellow physician, Saint Hermolaus, practiced medicine with great skill and with much success. They treated patients not only with medicine, but also with the power of prayer. Panteliemon, in fact, was denounced as a Christian and martyred for his Faith at the initiative of jealous doctors who could not cure as well as he could.

The name Panteleimon means "all merciful." Indeed this great saint was all merciful in extending his healing remedies to his patients in the form of medicine and prayer. Let us not neglect to call upon him today to pray with us, and to pray for us as well, as to pray for the doctors who treat us. The prayers of this great saint are powerful indeed!
