Dear Parishioners,

Glory to Jesus Christ!

The heart of Christmas is Christmas in the heart. We cannot truly experience Christmas unless we have it in our hearts. Experiencing the holiday in our hearts means having Christ at the center of our hearts. This simple reason is why many people cannot truly experience Christmas. They carry everything else in their hearts except for Christ. God does the greatest things in silence. For example, Christ coming to earth and becoming one of us, was the greatest event of the universe, yet it happened quietly in the darkest spot of the Judean desert near Bethlehem. When we want to experience the true meaning of Christmas, let us invite Christ into our hearts, to the darkest spot of our soul. We do not have to be holy in order to invite him, otherwise we would be waiting forever. Let us invite him now as we are, simple, weak, and full of fear. When the desert fathers were experiencing difficulties in their spiritual struggle, and were at the ends of their ropes, they recited the simple words of Psalm 70: "Deign, O God, to rescue me; O Lord, make haste to help me." God is waiting for our invitation into the darkest, weakest spot of our hearts, our souls, so he can touch it and heal it. Once this happens we will experience the true meaning of Christmas. It seems like a very small thing on the outside, yet it is a great thing on the inside. Why? Because we invite Christ to touch the weak spots of our heart. When he does so, we start seeing our sins and weaknesses, and at that moment we receive the grace to confess them. This is true healing and the true meaning of Christmas, to have Christ in our hearts.

I wish all of you a blessed remainder of the Philip's Fast (Advent), not only as we are expecting Christ, but also as Christ is expecting us, so we can joyfully sing on Christmas Day the Troparion: "Your birth, O Christ our God, has shed upon the world the light of knowledge..."

The Great Feast

This familiar parable is read in the Church each year just two Sundays before the feast of our Lord's Nativity. In it we are reminded of the great care with which God prepared the way of His incarnation. All of the Law and the Prophets look forward to this moment, the moment when the God-man Jesus Christ comes into the world. He is, in fact, the fulfillment of the Law and the Prophets – the goal towards which they were all aiming. The whole world was prepared by them for this great event. As the parable tells us the King – that is God – has prepared a great feast for us and has invited us to come and enter into the joy that He has prepared for us.

Today we begin in earnest to move toward the

feast of the birth of our Incarnate Savior Jesus Christ. Today we are called to see the great preparation that has gone into this event, to marvel at the great love and care of God for us that He would labor so long and with such great care for us. Today we look back at the whole of the history of the people of God and see that it is the history of God's preparation all leading to the moment when He would take flesh, become incarnate and enter the world as a child. We have been given an invitation to come and join the feast, to abandon the world and enter the Kingdom of God, to leave our own life and receive instead the Life of Christ. We have been invited, chosen by God - will we then accept the invitation and choose Him?
